Biographical Information/Overview of Interview: Mark A. Flotow was born in May 1955 in Melrose Park, Illinois. He worked for many years as a demographer and statistician, retiring in 2012 as a Division chief at the Illinois Center for Health Statistics, Illinois Dept. of Public Health.

In 2019 Mark published a book entitled In Their Letters, *In Their Words: Illinois Civil War Soldiers Write Home*, the product of years of diligent work combing the vast collection of Civil War soldier letters archived at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library's manuscript department. He compiled and edited hundreds of excerpts from Civil War letters and provided a detailed narrative which provided context for the quotes he selected. Mark organized the book around several themes he encountered while combing through thousands of letters, and eventually selected excerpts from 165 correspondents. The book was published in 2019 by the Southern Illinois University Press. In November 2020 Dr. Mark DePue interviewed Flotow about the process of writing the book during one of the Presidential Museum's series of Facebook Live presentations. The two were introduced by the Museum's programing director, Joe Crain.
