Biographical Information Overview of Interview: Dr. Frank Beck was born on September 30th, 1966 in Cleveland, Ohio, and grew up and went to school at Walsh Jesuit in Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, graduating in 1984. For the past fourteen years, he has been at Illinois State University teaching in the Sociology Department. At the time of the interview he served as chair of the Center for Economic and Community Development. The Center has been active in data collection on wind farms, labor and economic trends, longitudinal studies and social - economic studies. The Center has recently completed a three-step Study of Illinois School Closures (Elementary, Junior High School). These studies have looked at demographic, economic, and educational causes of school closure, the most important and leading trends leading to closure, the results of school closure, and what if any benefits may a closure cause a county, district, or community. Dr. Beck additional work will be ongoing on this data. The School Closure Study examined data from 1972-2005.
