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Abstract

Biographical Information Overview of Interview: Vincent Speranza was born on March 23rd, 1925 in the Hell's Kitchen neighborhood of Manhattan, New York. He grew up on Staten Island in a large and extended Italian family during the depression, and was inducted into the Army in October 1943. He served with the 501st Parachute Infantry Regiment, 101st Airborne Division, and saw action at Bastogne during the Battle of the Bulge, and in Germany.

This is a follow-on interview with Mr. Speranza, who was interviewed extensively in 2010 about his experiences growing up, his combat duty, and his life after the war. This interview focuses on the many experiences he has had since his first trip to Bastogne in 2009, some sixty-five years after the Battle of the Bulge. Since that time, Speranza's life has evolved in ways that he could not have imagined. As one of the last surviving members of the 101st who is able to attend reunion events at Bastogne, he carries the banner for his generation. He has been able to reconnect with people he knew and touched not only in Bastogne, but also in England. He has been treated as warmly by all those he meets, and has become a spokesman for all those who served in the 101st during the war. Vince talks at length about these experiences, and about how his life has changed since that first visit in 2009.
