### Abstract Scott Porter, *Ronald Reagan*, ISR-V-D-2013-108

**Biographical Information Overview of Interview**: Scott Porter was born in Dixon, Illinois in 1964 and was raised in nearby Rock Falls. In 1986 he graduated from Rhema Bible Training College in Tulsa, Oklahoma and has been the pastor at Sterling's Abiding Word Church for over twenty six years at the time of the interview. Porter first saw Ronald Reagan in 1980 during his campaign in Whiteside County, Illinois. Porter developed a life-long fascination in history and in President Reagan, and recounts through his interview a variety of encounters that he had with the president. He discusses the birthday party that Dixon threw for the president in 1984, and the speech the president gave at the local high school in 1990 where Reagan received a letterman's jacket. On September 11, 1998 Porter and Todd Bailey visited Ronald Reagan in his office in California. By this point, the Alzheimer's had taken over and Reagan did not remember his presidency. Because of his passion for history and his love of Ronald Reagan and his life, Porter has served on the board of the Boyhood Home since 2006 and headed up such organizations as the Reagan Centennial Commission.
