Biographical Information Overview of Interview: Born in Cardiff, Wales in 1947 but growing up in small south Wales mining villages, Richard Carwardine attended a public [i.e., private] school in Monmouth, Wales, then Oxford University for undergraduate and graduate work, completing his dissertation on American religious revivalists in the U.K. in the decades before the American civil war. He spent a year at the University of California – Berkeley in 1969-70, then taught mostly American history fulltime at Sheffield University, England from 1971-2002. He married Linda M. Kirk in 1975. He was named Rhodes Professor of American History and Institutions at Oxford University in 2002, a post he held till 2009, then served as president of Corpus Christi College, Oxford, from 2010 until his retirement in 2016. His early work focused on American and Anglo-American religious activity during the 19th century, until he was asked in 2002 to write a biography of Lincoln for Longmans (acquired by Pearson) entitled Lincoln: A Life of Purpose and Power. This book won the prestigious Lincoln Prize (\$50,000) even before it was published in the United States by Knopf in 2006. His serious political study, full of jokes, for the Concise Lincoln Library of S.I.U. Press, Lincoln's Sense of Humor (2017), brought him to Springfield again in February 2018 to speak to the annual banquet of the Abraham Lincoln Association; and at three other places in the east.
