Biographical Information Overview of Interview: Mrs. Doris Reynolds Lewis was born on February 28, 1944 in Whiteville, Tennessee. She was one of five children of Hayes and Rosabelle Reynolds. Mrs. Lewis met and married Clyde Lewis in 1999. Mr. Lewis worked at ADM and retired from the company as a machine operator. Mrs. Lewis hobbies include reading and working crossword puzzles. She is active in her church and serves as a Deaconess and the Chairperson of the Education/Scholarship Committee. Mrs. Lewis has one child, John Christopher Woods, and two grandchildren, Karly and Alex.
