

We invite Illinois youth and young adults, ages 11-21, to create a 3- to 7-minute film addressing the topic of racial healing. Animations of at least 45 seconds in length will also be accepted. The contest opens for submissions on February 1, 2021 and all films must be submitted to Film Freeway by end of day April 30, 2021, to be considered for judging.

Participants may enter films individually or with a group to one of the following age brackets:

- 11-14
- · 15-18
- 19-21

There will be one 1st place winner, one 2nd place winner, and one 3rd place winner in each contest age bracket. The awards for each place are:

- 1st Place: \$2,000 cash prize
- 2nd Place: \$1,000 cash prize
- 3rd Place: \$500 cash prize

Winning films will premiere at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum's No Malice Film Contest on July 31, 2021. They will be screened again at EbertFest at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign in Fall 2021 and offered to educators as part of an online curriculum using peer films to address racial healing with youth.


