Abstract

Biographical Information/Overview of Interview: Christine (Hoy) Radogno was born on December 21, 1952 in Oak Park, Illinois, and grew up in an Irish Catholic family in Wheaton and LaGrange. She graduated in Lyons Township High School in 1969 at 16, then attended Loyola University, graduating with a masters' degree in 1974 in social work. That same year she married Nunzio Radogno, who was studying to become a lawyer at the time.

In 1989 Radogno was elected to the LaGrange Village Board after getting involved in a fight to block the construction of a new Fire Station in a residential district. Due to her increasing visibility, the Republican Party leadership asked her to run for the Illinois Senate in 1996, a race which she won. That same year Barack Obama was also elected to the Illinois Senate. Radogno continued to serve in the Illinois Senate through the Gov. Jim Edgar, George Ryan and Rod Blagojevich era, eventually taking a leadership position in the Republican caucus. In 2009, following Minority Leader Frank Watson's retirement due to a stroke, Senator Radogno became the Minority Leader. She served in that position throughout the six years of the Governor Pat Quinn administration from 2009 to January 2015, as well as in the early years of the Gov. Bruce Rauner administration. Radogno supported the new Governor's turn-around agenda, but due to solid Democratic majorities in both the IL Senate and House, Rauner's proposals went nowhere. It was during his administration that the state went for over two years without a budget. (Due to court orders, state employees continued to be paid, while many businesses and individuals with contracts with the state went unpaid.) Frustrated by the lack of progress and Rauner's reluctance to negotiate and compromise, Senator Radogno worked with Senate President John Cullerton to develop a 'Grand Bargain' which would get the state past the impasse. When that bargain fell apart in June 2017, Radogno felt she had done all she could and resigned, effective July 1. A budget was subsequently passed, but only after several Republican defections.
