Abstract

Biographical Information Overview of Interview: Carole Oglesby was born in Fort Smith, Arkansas in 1938 and spent the first ten years of her life in Oklahoma, before moving to California. She graduated from High School in 1957. She received both her bachelor's and master's in physical education from the University of California, Los Angeles in 1961 and 1964. She received her PhD in physical education from Purdue University in 1969. She received a second PhD in psychology from Temple University in 1999.

Carole served as the second commissioner of national championships for the Commission on Intercollegiate Athletics for Women [CIAW]; and it was her experience in this position that led to her being chosen as the first president of the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women [AIAW], serving from 1971-72. She also served as the Girls and Women in Sports [GWS] president in the mid-1970s. From 1972 to 1992 she served as one of two AAHPERD reps to the U.S. collegiate sports council. She also received emeritus professor from Temple University.
