# Abstract

**Biographical Information Overview of Interview:** Dr. Lori Sundberg was born in Galesburg, Illinois in 1958, and graduated from Galesburg High School in 1976. She was a student at Carl Sandburg College, also in Galesburg, before moving to Knox College. She earned a bachelor's degree from Knox College in History and Economics, a master's degree in business administration from Western Illinois University, capping her credentials with a Doctorate from St. Ambrose University in Iowa. Early in her career she operated her own business. After her advanced degree work, Dr. Sundberg was hired at Sandburg College to be involved in research and data collection. She later became a Dean, involved with marketing, human resources, as well as negotiations and administrative/academic affairs.

Dr. Sundberg became the President of Carl Sandburg College in 2010. She discusses her own experiences at Carl Sandburg as a student at the college and as a longtime Galesburg resident, and discusses the community's relationship with the college.
