Biographical Information Overview of Interview: Kay Thread was born in September 1950 in Robinson, Illinois and grew up in Springfield, Illinois. Following high school graduation, she attended college for several years, then married Jerry Smith in 1972. The couple moved away from Springfield the following year. Kay served as a chief assistant in a major law firm for many years. In 2006 the Smiths returned to Springfield, where Kay volunteered at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum. She soon applied for and received a contract to serve as the Lincoln Bicentennial Coordinator for the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency's (IHPA). In that capacity Smith coordinated all of the events related to the bicentennial of Abraham Lincoln's birth on February 12, 2009. Following, her work as the Lincoln Bicentennial Coordinator, Smith served as the Executive Director of Looking for Lincoln.

This interview covers Kay's work with the Looking for Lincoln Heritage Coalition as a contractor and then Executive Director of the Abraham Lincoln National Heritage Area from late 2009 through 2011. Smith discusses her involvement in the development of the comprehensive management plan for the Abraham Lincoln National Heritage Area. She also talks about several other projects and programs that were occurring while she served as its executive director.
